His remembrance of us goes with his good works. He brought us help and hope. He built up Samal and Orani. As he formed the Suhay Foundation, established Villa Esperanza and created Tamarind Groove DM Consunji redeveloped Bataan. He makes us known.

We will never forget his caring marching order as our Virgen Milagrosa del Rosario College Seminary in Balanga would be constructed, personally telling VP Gerry, Engineer Marjorie, Delfin and Benny "let the laborers be from Samal, from Bataan. Give them works. With employment their life is

secured and will prosper." He always returned to his roots. He always remembered his place and his people, always doing and giving what is best and beneficial to them.

My brothers and sisters, we have this very emphatic Pilipino maxim, which goes like this, "ang hindi lumingon sa pinanggalingan ay hindi makakarating sa kanyang paroroonan." In spite of his numerous achievements and outstanding accomplishments, like him, we must still return and recognize those people who have been part of our life.

Accordingly it is not only to commemorate the heroic sacrifices and the gallant stand of Filipino and American soldiers in defense of freedom, and not only to promote the idea of universal peace and friendship among nations. But much more DM in his idea that putting a huge cross on that historic mountain with elevation of 544.7 meters anyone and everybody going to Bataan and seeing that cross will eventually "look up to God." It is to raise our sight to God, to focus our vision to God.

My brothers and sisters when we are tested and troubled let us look up to God with trust. And when we have been fortunate and fruitful let us look up to God in gratitude.

And this has been the faith of DM to God. He was deeply rooted with God. He always took refuge to God. As we priests in Bataan have been told that during his review and days of Board Examinations in Engineering, DM would ever let a day passed without going to Manila Cathedral to pray to our Blessed Mother, the Immaculate Conception. Was it not an act of gratitude and moment of grace that DMCI took the historic restoration of the said Minor Basilica, the so called Manila Cathedral?

With his faith is seen with his fidelity to God. The construction of the Holy Sacrifice chapel in the University of the Philippines is living testament to it. It was raining heavily for that week, with the pouring of cement schedule on that very next day. And it was still raining on that early morning. Everybody was worried. Should they stop? Or should postpone when weather permits?
